17.2.5 - DMIHER(DU) collaborate with NGOs to tackle the SDGs through student volunteering programmes, research programmes, development of educational resources

The Early Clinical Exposure is hallmark of DMIHER outreach training and is extended to all Health Professional streams. Unique Comprehensive Community Health Program, is an orientation towards primary health care of community wherein an integrated Health team are posted in unison to the community with defined objectives. 'Family Adoption Program' wherein five families from adopted villages are allocated to each team comprising of learners from Medicine, Dentistry, Ayurveda, Physiotherapy, Nursing and Allied Health Sciences for targeted health-related awareness throughout his/her professional training.

The said outreach has gone a long way in inculcating AETCOM skills amongst learners. Postings to Rural and Urban health training centres, participation in health camps, NSS activities and health awareness programs are all part of community-based training. Participation in Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Mobile Health clinics, Cancer screening Programs, participation in National health programs, allows students to be exposed to Community-based services & activities.

Students actively participate in awareness programs and health check- up in various nearby district Schools, industries, Police station, railway station and bus stand etc. The Student welfare cell, through its eleven student clubs and NSS provides ample opportunities for extension and outreach activities. One of the notable initiative is establishment of 'Organ donation awareness society' that includes student members from all the constituent units.

In tune with 'Research and Publication model for Undergraduate Competency- based Education' research skills are inculcated right from 1st professional Year by orienting learners towards research methodology, bioethics, project based learning, statistics and scientific

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writing that has resulted in nearly one- fifth of scientific publications output of the entire University coming from a well over 90% of the learners opting for the same.

The Postgraduate program mandates PPPP research and publication model

- 1. Participation in PG orientation programme,
- 2. Poster presentation,
- 3. Paper presentation
- 4. Publication in an indexed (Scopus/Pubmed/WOS) journal.

Each PG and Doctoral scholar have to undertake 'Basic course in Research Methodology'. Value-added course on 'Systematic literature review & Meta-analysis' is conducted annually. The practice of all the students mandatorily required to have at least one Intramural research project has resulted in University securing 113 UG ICMR-STS projects and 51 PG thesis support till date consistently fetching it a place amongst top 3 HEI's in the country. Seven students secured two consecutive E YUV A fellowship grants from BIRAC in innovative research. In addition, 05 STS projects were granted by Ministry of AYUSH in the maiden year of its launch.
